# A MONTHLY ROUND UP OF NEWS & EVENTS

### **BRINGING OFFENDERS TO JUSTICE**

February has so far seen some responsive policing across the district, which was no exception on Wednesday 3 February, when two men were arrested following the execution of a warrant in Gt Wakering. Police attended an address in Rushley Close, Great Wakering, where having gained entry, substances believed to be controlled drugs were found. Officers arrested a 48-year-old man, and a 21-year-old man,



both from Gt Wakering on suspicion of production, concerned in supply of drugs and the abstraction of electricity. Both men have since been released under investigation while enquires continue.

During December 2024, we received information about a burglary and two attempted burglaries in Marina Avenue, Rayleigh, following extensive resulting enquiries, a 30 year-old man from Southend was arrested and he has now been charged with burglary, attempted burglary, taking a vehicle without consent, fraud by false representation, and possession of cannabis.



### **DISTRICT STATISTICS**



#### A snapshot of some of the things your Rochford Officers have dealt with during January

We helped to find 22 people who were reported missing and helped them to get the support they needed.

We investigated 17 reports of antisocial behaviour having listened to local communities about the things which were causing them concern.

We attended 25 road traffic collisions, helping to keep those involved safe and our roads moving.

We investigated 104 reports of domestic violence incidents and made sure victims were given help, support, and advice, putting them in contact with relevant organisations where appropriate.

We solved 52 crimes, ensuring those intent on committing crime are held accountable for their actions.

We submitted 183 pieces of intelligence, which assists us in targeting criminal activity in our community.

Our officers also stopped and searched 38 people within our district, to make sure they weren't carrying anything which could cause harm to themselves or someone else.

### **KEEP THE KEYS SAFE**

Vehicles today are more difficult to steal, unless the thief can access your key or fob to clone them. Keep your keys safe, out of view when at home, and away from your front door, and make use of a faraday pouch.

It's not uncommon for car keys to be stolen from inside your home by thieves fishing for them with a stick and hook through the letterbox.

If you're selling your car and you meet up with a potential buyer, do not allow the keys out of your sight. Your keys may be cloned by thieves and used later to steal your vehicle.
